Re: Notice of Data Security Incident

Dear Attorney General Formella,

Constangy, Brooks, Smith & Prophete LLP represents Regina Caeli, Inc. (“Regina Caeli”) in connection with the data security incident described in greater detail below. In reporting this matter, Regina Caeli reserves all rights and defenses regarding the applicability of New Hampshire law, the applicability of the New Hampshire data event notification statute, personal jurisdiction, and all other potentially applicable rights and defenses.

1. Nature of the incident.

On December 17, 2025, Regina Caeli discovered suspicious email activity and immediately initiated an investigation of the matter. Regina Caeli engaged independent cybersecurity experts to assist with the process. As a result of the investigation, Regina Caeli determined that certain email messages were accessed and/or acquired without authorization. Regina Caeli undertook a review of those email messages to evaluate the specific information contained therein.

On February 21, 2026, Regina Caeli learned that personal information as defined by N.H. Rev. Stat. §§ 359-C:19 - C:21 belonging to one New Hampshire resident was contained within the affected email messages. Regina Caeli has no evidence to suggest misuse or attempted misuse of any personal information in conjunction with this incident.

2. Number of New Hampshire residents notified.

Regina Caeli notified one New Hampshire resident of this incident on March 13, 2026. The information potentially impacted in connection with this incident includes name and driver’s license number. A sample copy of the notification letter is included with this correspondence.

3. Steps taken relating to the Incident.

As soon as Regina Caeli discovered this incident, Regina Caeli took steps to secure its environment and launched an investigation to determine what happened and the scope of personal information

potentially impacted. In addition, Regina Caeli implemented measures to enhance the security of its environment in an effort to minimize the risk of a similar incident occurring in the future.

Regina Caeli reported this incident to the FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center and will cooperate with any resulting investigation.

Regina Caeli provided the notified individual with information about steps they can take to help protect their personal information and offered them access to complimentary identity protection services.

I am writing to inform you of a data security incident experienced by Regina Caeli Inc. (“Regina Caeli”) that may have affected your personal information. Regina Caeli takes the privacy and security of all information within its possession very seriously. Please read this letter carefully as it contains information regarding the incident and steps that you can take to help protect your personal information.

What Happened. On December 17, 2025, Regina Caeli discovered suspicious activity associated with one employee’s email account and immediately initiated an investigation of the matter. Regina Caeli engaged independent cybersecurity experts to assist with the process. As a result of the investigation, Regina Caeli learned that certain email messages were accessed and/or acquired without authorization. In response, Regina Caeli undertook a review of those items and, on or about February 21, 2026, learned that some of your personal information was contained therein which is the reason for this notification. Regina Caeli has no evidence of the misuse, or attempted misuse, of any potentially impacted information.

What Information Was Involved. The information may have included your name and driver’s license number.

What We Are Doing. As soon as Regina Caeli discovered this incident, it took the steps described above and implemented measures to enhance security and minimize the risk of a similar incident occurring in the future. Regina Caeli also notified the Federal Bureau of Investigation of this incident and will cooperate with any efforts to hold the perpetrator(s) accountable. Finally, Regina Caeli is also offering you complimentary identity protection services through <<Vendor>>, a leader in consumer identity protection. These services include <<12 / 24>> months of credit monitoring¹, dark web monitoring, a \$1 million identity fraud loss reimbursement policy, and fully managed identity theft recovery services. The deadline to enroll in these services is <<Date>>.

¹ To receive credit monitoring services, you must be over the age of 18 and have established credit in the U.S., have a Social Security number in your name, and have a U.S. residential address associated with your credit file.

Steps You Can Take to Help Protect Your Personal Information

Review Your Account Statements and Notify Law Enforcement of Suspicious Activity: As a precautionary measure, we recommend that you remain vigilant by reviewing your account statements and credit reports closely. If you detect any suspicious activity on an account, you should promptly notify the financial institution or company with which the account is maintained. You also should promptly report any fraudulent activity or any suspected incidence of identity theft to proper law enforcement authorities, your state attorney general, and/or the Federal Trade Commission (the "FTC").

Copy of Credit Report: You may obtain a free copy of your credit report from each of the three major credit reporting agencies once every 12 months by visiting www.annualcreditreport.com, calling toll-free 1-877-322-8228, or by completing an Annual Credit Report Request Form and mailing it to Annual Credit Report Request Service, P.O. Fraud Alert: You may want to consider placing a fraud alert on your credit report. An initial fraud alert is free and will stay on your credit file for at least one year. The alert informs creditors of possible fraudulent activity within your report and requests that the creditor contact you prior to establishing any accounts in your name. To place a fraud alert on your credit report, contact any of the three credit reporting agencies identified above. Additional information is available at www.annualcreditreport.com.

Security Freeze: You have the right to put a security freeze on your credit file for up to one year at no cost. This will prevent new credit from being opened in your name without the use of a PIN number that is issued to you when you initiate the freeze. A security freeze is designed to prevent potential creditors from accessing your credit report without your consent. As a result, using a security freeze may interfere with or delay your ability to obtain credit. You must separately place a security freeze on your credit file with each credit reporting agency. In order to place a security freeze, you may be required to provide the consumer reporting agency with information that identifies you including your full name, Social Security number, date of birth, current and previous addresses, a copy of your state-issued identification card, and a recent utility bill, bank statement or insurance statement.

Additional Free Resources: You can obtain information from the consumer reporting agencies, the FTC, or from your respective state Attorney General about fraud alerts, security freezes, and steps you can take toward preventing identity theft. You may report suspected identity theft to local law enforcement, including to the FTC or to the Attorney General in your state.
