**Re: Security Incident Notification**

Dear Sir or Madame,

I write on behalf of Gator Cases, LLC (“Gator”) with respect to a data security event involving certain personal information of New Hampshire residents. By providing this notice, Gator does not waive any rights or defenses regarding the applicability of New Hampshire law or personal jurisdiction.

On April 28, 2026, Gator discovered it was the victim of a ransomware attack. Gator immediately retained a respected external security expert to help investigate, block the unauthorized activity, restore systems from clean backups, and strengthen Gator's security safeguards. Gator also notified federal law enforcement and is cooperating with their investigation. Gator's investigation revealed that the unauthorized activity occurred from April 27 to April 28, 2026, but no evidence of any subsequent unauthorized activity in Gator's systems. Gator also promptly retained a third party vendor to help review the impacted information to identify potentially impacted individuals, which the third party completed on May 26, 2026.

Based on Gator's investigation, it believes that approximately 4 New Hampshire residents may have been affected by this incident. The data involved included names, Social Security Numbers, email addresses, account logon credentials, addresses, dates of birth, driver's license or state ID number, passport information, and payment card information.

Gator is providing written notification to all impacted individuals for whom Gator has a mailing address as well as free identity protection services for twenty-four (24) months through Experian. Experian identity protection services include: identity monitoring, credit monitoring, identity restoration, and \$1 million of identity theft insurance. A copy of the template notification letter is enclosed as Exhibit 1.

Gator also has implemented measures to further strengthen its security, including providing additional training to its employees, changing passwords, revoking active user sessions, creating additional backups, strengthening endpoint protection, performing multiple system-wide threat detection audits and scans, and enhancing other cybersecurity safeguards.

### Notice of Data Breach

Dear Sample A. Sample,

We write to inform you about a cybersecurity incident at Gator Cases, LLC (“Gator” or “we”) that may have impacted your personal information.

#### WHAT HAPPENED?

On April 28, 2026, Gator discovered it was the victim of a ransomware attack. Gator immediately retained a respected external security expert to help investigate, block the unauthorized activity, restore systems from clean backups, and strengthen our security safeguards. Gator also notified federal law enforcement and is cooperating with their investigation. Our investigation indicated that the unauthorized activity occurred from April 27 to April 28, 2026. On May 26, 2026, our investigation determined that this incident may have impacted your personal information.

#### WHAT INFORMATION WAS INVOLVED?

The personal information varied from individual to individual but may have included name; contact information; government identification number; Social Security number; account logon credentials; health information; and/or payment card information.

#### WHAT WE ARE DOING

We take safeguarding your information seriously. We promptly terminated the unauthorized access and worked with cybersecurity experts to confirm the scope of the incident and block further unauthorized activity. We have also taken steps to strengthen Gator’s security safeguards.

To help protect your identity, we are offering complimentary identity protection services through Experian IdentityWorks<sup>SM</sup> for 24 months. While identity restoration assistance is immediately available to you, we also encourage you to activate the fraud detection tools available through Experian IdentityWorks as a complimentary 24-month membership. This product provides you with superior identity detection and resolution of identity theft. To start monitoring your personal information, please follow the steps below:

- Ensure that you **enroll by** August 31, 2026 (Your code will not work after this date.)
- **Visit** the Experian IdentityWorks website to enroll: <https://www.experianidworks.com/1Bcredit>
- Provide your **activation code**: ABCDEFGHI

Please note that Identity Restoration is available to you for 24 months from the date of this letter and does not require any action on your part at this time. ### GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT IDENTITY THEFT PROTECTION

You should remain vigilant for incidents of fraud and identity theft by reviewing credit card account statements and monitoring your credit report for unauthorized activity. This notification was not delayed for law enforcement purposes.

**Credit Reports.** Under federal law, you are entitled to one free copy of your credit report every 12 months from each of the three nationwide credit reporting agencies. You may obtain a free copy of your credit report by going to [www.AnnualCreditReport.com](http://www.AnnualCreditReport.com) or by calling (877) 322-8228. You also may complete the Annual Credit Report Request Form available from the FTC at [www.consumer.ftc.gov/articles/pdf-0093-annual-report-request-form.pdf](http://www.consumer.ftc.gov/articles/pdf-0093-annual-report-request-form.pdf), and mail it to Annual Credit Report Request Service, P.O. **Fraud Alert.** You may place a fraud alert in your file by calling one of the three nationwide credit reporting agencies above. A fraud alert tells creditors to follow certain procedures, including contacting you before they open any new accounts or change your existing accounts. For that reason, placing a fraud alert can protect you, but also may delay you when you seek to obtain credit.

**Place a Security Freeze on your Credit Report.** You also have the right to place a security freeze on your credit report by contacting any of the credit bureaus listed above. A security freeze is intended to prevent credit, loans, and services from being approved in your name without your consent. To place a security freeze on your credit report, you may be able to use an online process, an automated telephone line or a written request. The following information must be included when requesting a security freeze (note that if you are requesting a credit report for your spouse, this information must be provided for him/her as well): (1) full name, with middle initial and any suffixes; (2) Social Security number; (3) date of birth; (4) current address and any previous addresses for the past five years; and (5) any applicable incident report or complaint with a law enforcement agency or the Registry of Motor Vehicles. The request must also include a

copy of a government-issued identification card and a copy of a recent utility bill or bank or insurance statement. You can place a freeze and lift a security freeze on your credit report free of charge.

**You may contact the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) and State Attorneys General Offices.** If you believe you are the victim of identity theft or have reason to believe your personal information has been misused, you should contact the FTC and/or your state's attorney general office for information on how to prevent or avoid identity theft. Further, pursuant to the Fair Credit Reporting Act, the consumer reporting bureaus must correct or delete inaccurate, incomplete, or unverifiable information; consumer reporting agencies may not report outdated negative information; access to your file is limited; you must give your consent for credit reports to be provided to employers; you may limit "prescreened" offers of credit and insurance you get based on information in your credit report; and you may seek damages from the violator. You may have additional rights under the Fair Credit Reporting Act not summarized here. Identity theft victims and active duty military personnel have specific additional rights pursuant to the Fair Credit Reporting Act.
