Re: Notice of Data Breach

To Whom It May Concern:

Cross Recruiting Inc., dba Cross Resource Group ("CRG") discovered that it was the victim of a cybersecurity incident that may affect the security of personal information regarding a resident in New Hampshire. We are writing to inform you of the incident, in compliance with New Hampshire data breach notification laws.

On or around May 19, 2026, CRG discovered that it had experienced a cybersecurity incident in which an employee inadvertently disclosed certain personal information to an unauthorized recipient (the "Incident"). As soon as we learned of this situation, CRG's IT Department quickly identified the threat, took action to request deletion or destruction of the information, and confirmed that it had not been further shared or used. The information potentially exposed may have included the first and last name, date of birth, address, employment tax information, Social Security number, and other identifying information ("PII") concerning a New Hampshire resident. To date, CRG is unaware of any actual or attempted misuse of PII for identity theft or fraud as a result of this Incident.

Upon discovery of the Incident, CRG engaged cyber security experts to launch an investigation and comply with all data privacy regulations and requirements. The Incident was discovered expeditiously, and security measures were implemented to contain the Incident and mitigate any potential impact. CRG recognizes that the files' security may have been impacted and is providing notice to both you and any potentially impacted New Hampshire residents, in accordance with state data breach notification laws.

At the time of this notice, one (1) New Hampshire resident has been identified, and CRG provided affected individuals notice of the security incident via U.S. mail on June 18, 2026. We foresee the potential that the number of New Hampshire residents who are impacted may increase as our investigation progresses.

Additionally, CRG has secured the services of TransUnion to establish 24-month no-cost credit and dark web monitoring for impacted individuals, as well as a call center to respond to any questions affected individuals may have about the cyberattack. A copy of the data breach notification letter, along with instructions for how affected individuals can place and remove a security freeze, is enclosed with this letter.

Thank you for your immediate attention to this situation, as well as your understanding in the short term. Our cybersecurity, as well as the safety and stability of our clients, vendors, and employees, is of the utmost importance to us. We remain committed to protecting the privacy and security of their information.

Notice of Data Breach

Dear Valued Employee or Former Employee:

Cross Recruiting Inc., dba Cross Resource Group (“CRG”) was the victim of a cybersecurity incident that may affect the security of your personal information. You are receiving this letter because you are a current or former employee of CRG. This letter will provide you with information about the incident, steps we are taking in response, and steps you may take to guard against identity theft and fraud, should you feel it is appropriate to do so.

What Happened? On or around May 19, 2026, CRG discovered that it had experienced a cybersecurity incident. An employee inadvertently disclosed certain personal information to an unauthorized recipient (the “Incident”). Upon discovery of the Incident, CRG engaged cyber security experts to launch an investigation and comply with all data privacy regulations and requirements. The Incident was discovered expeditiously, and security measures were implemented to contain the Incident and mitigate any potential impact.

What Information Was Involved? The information potentially exposed may have included employment data, which could include sensitive personal information, such as your first and last name, address, certain payroll information, Social Security Number, employee tax information, and other identifying information.

To date, CRG is unaware of any misuse (or attempted misuse) of your personal information for identity theft or fraud stemming from the Incident.

What Are We Doing? As soon as we learned of this situation, CRG’s IT Department quickly identified the threat, took action to request deletion or destruction of the information, and confirmed that it had not been further shared or used. CRG engaged cyber security experts to investigate the scope of the disclosure and attempt to resolve any impact of the Incident.

While CRG has made several significant investments in its cyber security systems, today’s environment demands constant refinement and diligence. CRG is working with its IT team and cyber security partner to constantly evaluate security protocols and processes to prevent future incidents.

What Actions Can You Take? As always, we recommend that you be on the alert for suspicious activity related to your financial accounts and credit reports. We encourage you to regularly monitor your statements and records to ensure there are no transactions or other activities that you did not initiate or authorize. You should report any suspicious activity to the appropriate service provider. If you observe unusual activity on any debit/credit card, or you believe your personal bank account shows signs of compromise, we advise you to close out those accounts and request new cards and account credentials.

Additionally, you should report incidents of suspected identity theft to your local law enforcement, the Federal Trade Commission (the “FTC”), and your state attorney general. To file a complaint with the FTC, go to [IdentityTheft.gov](https://www.ftc.gov/identitytheft) or call 1-877-ID-THEFT (1 (877) 438-4338). Complaints filed with the FTC will be added to the FTC’s Identity Theft Data Clearinghouse, which is a database made available to law enforcement agencies. Information on how to contact your state attorney general can be found in Appendix A to this letter.

Additionally, under the Fair Credit Reporting Act, you have the right to know what is in your file and receive notification if information in your file has been used against you in applying for credit or other transactions. All consumers are entitled to one free disclosure every 12 months upon request from each nationwide credit bureau and from nationwide specialty consumer reporting agencies. See www.consumerfinance.gov/learnmore for additional information.

Placing a Security Freeze

Any consumer may place a free security freeze on their credit report by: (i) requesting one in writing by certified mail to the consumer reporting agency, (ii) calling the agency directly, or (iii) submitting a form online directly to the agency. A security freeze prohibits a credit reporting agency from releasing any information from a consumer's credit report without written authorization. Please be aware that placing a security freeze on your credit report may delay, interfere with, or prevent the timely approval of any requests you make for new loans, credit, mortgages, employment, housing or other services. We recommend that you work with potential lenders, employers and service providers to ensure that you are protecting both your information and the approval status of your applicable request.

To place a security freeze on your credit reports, you must contact each of the following major consumer reporting agencies: Equifax (www.equifax.com); TransUnion (www.transunion.com); and Experian (www.experian.com), at the addresses below:

The credit reporting agencies have a certain number of days after receiving your request to place a security freeze on your credit report, so we recommend placing the freeze as soon as you possibly can. The credit bureaus must also send written confirmation to you, and may provide you with a unique personal identification number (PIN) or password, or both, that can be used by you to authorize the removal or temporary lifting of the security freeze.

Lifting or Suspending a Security Freeze

To temporarily lift or suspend the security freeze, you must call, make a request online, or send a request via electronic media to the credit reporting agencies and include proper identification (name, address, and social security number) and the PIN number (if provided) or password provided to you when you placed the security freeze. Please note, your state may not allow this action to be completed. You should always check your state's laws on credit freezing before placing a freeze on your credit report.

Removing a Security Freeze

To remove the security freeze, you can either submit the request online, or send a written request to each of the three credit bureaus by mail, secure electronic method, or via their online form, and include proper identification (name, address, and social security number) and the PIN number (if provided) or password provided to you when you placed the security freeze.

Credit Monitoring

Although we do not have any evidence that your personal information has been misused for identity theft or fraud, out of an abundance of caution, CRG is offering complimentary access to **Single Bureau Credit Monitoring/Single Bureau Credit Report/Single Bureau Credit Score** services at no charge. These services provide you with alerts for 24 months from the date of enrollment when changes occur to your credit file. This notification is sent to you the same day that the change or update takes place with the bureau. Finally, we are providing you with proactive

fraud assistance to help with any questions that you might have or in event that you become a victim of fraud. These services will be provided by Cyberscout, a TransUnion company specializing in fraud assistance and remediation services.

How do I enroll for the free services?

To enroll in Credit Monitoring services at no charge, please log on to <https://bfs.cyberscout.com/activate> and follow the instructions provided. When prompted please provide the following unique code to receive services: **550099775FAC**. In order for you to receive the monitoring services described above, you must enroll within 90 days from the date of this letter. The enrollment requires an internet connection and e-mail account and may not be available to minors under the age of 18 years of age. Please note that when signing up for monitoring services, you may be asked to verify personal information for your own protection to confirm your identity.

For More Information. Representatives are available for 90 days from the date of this letter, to assist you with questions regarding this incident, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Eastern time, Monday through Friday, excluding holidays. Please call the help line at 1-800-405-6108 and supply the fraud specialist with your unique code listed above.

Thank you for your immediate attention to this situation, as well as your understanding in the short-term. Our cyber security, as well as the safety and stability of our employees, current, former, and future, is of the utmost importance to us.

We will advise you of any relevant or necessary updates as they become available. Again, we sincerely apologize for any impact this Incident has caused.
