To Whom it May Concern,

We serve as counsel for the Green Accounting & Tax LLC located at 100 E Taylor St, Ste 1, Creston, IA 50801, and write to provide notification of a recent data security incident. By providing this notice, Green Accounting does not waive any rights or defenses under Iowa law, including the data breach notification statute.

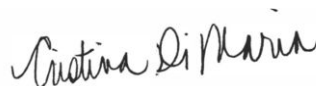
On April 27, 2026, Green Accounting discovered unusual activity on its network and immediately took steps to secure Green Accounting's systems and began an investigation. Additionally, Green Accounting swiftly engaged a third-party team of forensic investigators to determine the full nature and scope of the incident and assist in responding in an appropriate manner. The investigation ultimately determined that certain information within Green Accounting environment may have been accessed or acquired by an unauthorized actor. Upon discovery, Green Accounting worked to identify and collect the potentially affected data to perform a comprehensive review in order to determine the types of information impacted and the individuals to whom the data relates. On July 13, 2026, this process was completed and Green Accounting worked to identify sufficient contact information to notify individuals whose information may have been impacted.

This process included performing a National Change of Address (NCOA) search to ensure as up-to-date information as possible. On August 11, 2026, Green Accounting received its results from the NCOA search and learned that this incident potentially affected 3,335 Iowa residents. The information potentially impacted included first and last name, Social Security number, driver's license number, and financial account information.

In response to this incident, Green Accounting took steps to respond to the incident and further secure their environment, conducted an investigation, and notified law enforcement. Additionally, Green Accounting began providing notice to the potentially impacted individuals on August 12, 2026, via U.S. mail. A copy of the notification letter is attached as Exhibit A. In an abundance of caution, Green Accounting is offering the potentially impacted individuals complimentary credit monitoring and identity protection services.

Green Accounting & Tax LLC (“Green Accounting”) writes to notify you of a recent data security incident that may affect the privacy of certain information belonging to you. While we have no evidence of attempted or actual misuse of any information, we are providing you with information about the incident, our response, and steps you can take to help protect your information, should you feel it appropriate to do so.

What Happened: On April 27, 2026, we became aware of suspicious activity within our network. Once identified, we took immediate steps to secure our network and engaged third-party specialists to assist in the containment of the activity and investigate the nature and scope of the activity. As a result, we learned that certain files were accessed by an unauthorized third party. We conducted a diligent review of the files to identify whether they contained personal information and, if so, what information was included and to whom that information relates. The investigation and review completed on July 13, 2026, and identified that the impacted files may have contained some of your personal information. **Please note that we have no evidence of fraud or misuse of any personal information and are notifying you out of an abundance of caution.**

What Information Was Involved: The information identified may have included your first and last name together with <<breached elements>>.

What We Are Doing: Upon learning of this incident, we immediately took steps to secure our network environment and undertook a thorough investigation. We implemented additional technical safeguards to further enhance the security of information in our possession and are reviewing our policies and procedures to prevent similar incidents from happening again in the future. Additionally, we are offering you <<cm duration>> months of complimentary identity protection services and credit monitoring at no cost to you.

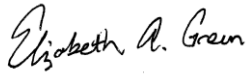
What You Can Do: We recommend that you remain vigilant in regularly reviewing and monitoring all of your account statements and credit history for suspicious activity and to detect errors. Additionally, if you have not done so already, you can enroll in the free credit monitoring services we are making available to you. Instructions on how to enroll is included in the enclosed *Steps You Can Take to Help Protect Your Information*. Please note that you must enroll yourself into the credit monitoring services as we cannot enroll you on your behalf.

STEPS YOU CAN TAKE TO HELP PROTECT YOUR INFORMATION

Enroll in Credit Monitoring/Identity Protection

Although we have no indication of any misuse of your information, we are providing you with access to Iris Identity Protection at no charge for <<CM Duration>> months. Please visit <https://iris-pro.myidentityprotectiononline.com> and enter the following promo code to enroll and begin your membership: <<Monitoring Code>> (case sensitive). Please note the deadline to enroll is 90 days from the date of this letter. Iris Identity Monitoring provides One-bureau credit monitoring from Equifax®, Identity Monitoring, Identity Fraud Insurance, and Identity Resolution Services.

Monitor Your Accounts

Under U.S. law, you are entitled to one free credit report annually from each of the three major credit reporting bureaus, TransUnion, Experian, and Equifax. To order your free credit report, visit www.annualcreditreport.com or call 1-877-322-8228. Once you receive your credit report, review it for discrepancies and identify any accounts you did not open or inquiries from creditors that you did not authorize. If you have questions or notice incorrect information, contact the credit reporting bureau.

You have the right to place an initial or extended fraud alert on a credit file at no cost. An initial fraud alert is a one-year alert that is placed on a consumer's credit file. Upon seeing a fraud alert, a business is required to take steps to verify the consumer's identity before extending new credit. If you are a victim of identity theft, you are entitled to an extended fraud alert lasting seven years. Should you wish to place a fraud alert, please contact any of the three credit reporting bureaus listed below.

As an alternative to a fraud alert, you have the right to place a credit freeze on a credit report, which will prohibit a credit bureau from releasing information in the credit report without your express authorization. The credit freeze is designed to prevent credit, loans, and services from being approved in your name without your consent. However, you should be aware that using a credit freeze may delay, interfere with, or prohibit the timely approval of any subsequent request or application you make regarding a new loan, credit, mortgage, or any other account involving the extension of credit. Pursuant to federal law, you cannot be charged to place or lift a credit freeze on your credit report. To request a credit freeze, you will need to provide the following information:

1. Full name (including middle initial as well as Jr., Sr., III, etc.);
2. Social Security number;
3. Date of birth;
4. Address for the prior two to five years;
5. Proof of current address, such as a current utility or telephone bill;
6. A legible photocopy of a government-issued identification card (e.g., state driver's license or identification card); and
7. A copy of either the police report, investigative report, or complaint to a law enforcement agency concerning identity theft, if you are a victim of identity theft.

Additional Information

You can further educate yourself regarding identity theft, fraud alerts, credit freezes, and the steps you can take to protect your personal information by contacting the credit reporting bureaus, the Federal Trade Commission (FTC), or your state Attorney General. The FTC also encourages those who discover that their information has been misused to file a complaint with them. The FTC may be reached at 600 Pennsylvania Ave. NW, Washington, D.C. 20580; www.identitytheft.gov; 1-877-ID-THEFT (1-877-438-4338); and TTY: 1-866-653-4261. You have the right to file a police report if you ever experience identity theft or fraud. Please note that in order to file a report with law enforcement for identity theft, you will likely need to provide some proof that you have been a victim. Instances of known or suspected identity theft should also be reported to law enforcement, your state Attorney General, and the FTC. This notice has not been delayed by law enforcement.

For New Mexico residents, you have rights pursuant to the Fair Credit Reporting Act, such as the right to be told if information in your credit file has been used against you, the right to know what is in your credit file, the right to ask for your credit score, and the right to dispute incomplete or inaccurate information. Further, pursuant to the Fair Credit Reporting Act: (i) the consumer reporting agencies must correct or delete inaccurate, incomplete, or unverifiable information; (ii) the consumer reporting agencies may not report outdated negative information; (iii) access to your file is limited; (iv) you must give consent for credit reports to be provided to employers; (v) you may limit “prescreened” offers of credit and insurance you get based on information in your credit report; (vi) and you may seek damages from violators.
