Re: Notice of Data Security Breach

Gentlepeople:

This letter is written to notify you of a data security breach that hit our law firm's main server. The breach took place on June 9, 2026 and was not detected until June 10, 2026. Our office immediately took steps to secure the server. Our IT specialist, Bruce Hildebrand, Director at Wizard Technology, indicated that our server had been encrypted but that he did not believe the hackers were able to get any information. Based on his expertise, we did not believe that our information had been uploaded/ stolen. We had a backup of the server, so we reformatted the server, uploaded the back up and continued operations. All of the passwords to the server, and each workstation were changed and became even more complicated than before. Additionally, we instituted a policy that the server will be disconnected from the internet each evening and not connected again until the next work day. All staff were trained on what to look for and how to handle suspicious emails and inquiries.

On August 20, 2026 we received an email from a hacker expecting us to make payment for the breach. The email included attachments of documents we recognized as pleadings that had been created by this office. We also saw some emails from one of the desk stations in our office. The hackers indicated they had 380 GB of our data. Realizing that our data had, in fact, been stolen, we immediately took steps to notify our clients. We sent a notification letter out, via the U.S. mail, to 1379 clients informing them of the breach on August 31, 2026. We believe this number is reasonable, given the data that we know was stolen. This number included all clients for which we have confidential information for the last 16 years. A copy of the letter that was sent out is attached. I have also attached a copy of the email that was received on August 20, 2026 informing us of the breach of data and threatening to post more and more pieces of information to a suspicious website if we did not negotiate with them within 2 days.

It is unknown the exact type of data and/or information that was taken but we regularly handle cases which require names, dates of birth, social security numbers, passwords, financial account numbers, physical addresses, email addresses, statutory warranty deeds

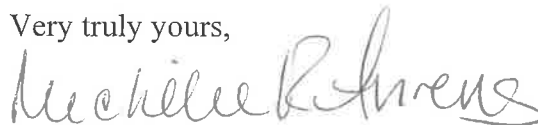

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and tax returns. We can only assume the hackers have some information from each of these categories could have been part of what was stolen. We do not know the extent of the damage to our clients or to us. Our server holds 4 terabytes of data which includes all of the above types of information for both our firm and our clients. We do know, that from the time they were able to access the server to when we discovered the breach and disconnected the server from the internet, they could not have possibly downloaded all of the information on the server. We simply do not know, at that point, if the claim that they have stolen 380 GB of our data is an exaggeration or a minimization.

Re: Data Security Breach

To our present and former clients:

We are writing to inform you of a recent security incident involving our law firm's computer systems. Our investigation determined that an unauthorized party gained access to a workstation and a small portion of our server. The files that we believe were compromised were an email account which may have contained confidential information and a portion of the server also containing client information. Both of these may have contained confidential personal and financial information for our firm and some of our clients.

At this time, we have no evidence that any personal information has been misused. However, out of an abundance of caution and in accordance with Washington State data-security notification requirements, we are notifying you so you can remain alert to any unusual activity involving your personal information and accounts.

We believe a breach occurred on or about June 9, 2026, which we discovered on June 10, 2026. At that time, we did not realistically believe that any information was acquired. On August 20, 2026, however, we received information leading us to believe that someone may have indeed acquired information.

Upon discovering the initial incident on June 9, 2026, we immediately secured the affected systems, initiated a full forensic review, and implemented additional safeguards to prevent similar incidents from occurring in the future. We are continuing to monitor our systems closely.

The type of information that may have been subject to the breach, are the email records, both sent and received by Peter Mogren, at the email address of mogren@mgrlaw.com. This could include not only the content of the emails, but also any attachments or documents included in the email. The other type of information that may have been subject to the breach concerns drafts of pleadings, letters, saved emails and other documents created by any of the attorney's we have employed since 2010 and/ or any of the staff. Additionally, we believe some financial records could possibly be compromised, as well.

More specifically, if you sent or received any emails from Peter Mogren, at the email address of mogren@mgrlaw.com, that contained any personal information, including social security numbers, driver's license numbers, financial account or credit card numbers, dates of birth, address or phone number or any other identification, you will want to take steps to protect yourself. The same will be true for clients of the other attorneys in our office with whom you provided confidential financial information and/or

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tax returns with us, or other documents which will contain financial account or credit card numbers, dates of birth, social security numbers, address(es) or telephone numbers.

What you can do:

- Review your accounts for any suspicious activity.
- Be cautious of unexpected communications requesting personal information.
- Consider updating passwords associated with sensitive accounts.
- Contact credit reporting agencies below and freeze your credit.

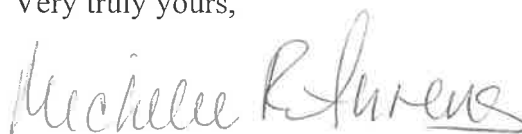
